## 2022, the European Year of Youth



The European Union declared the year **2022** the 'year of the Youth' and called upon the engagement and participation of all young and talented people to help build a better future for all: **stable**, **green**, **inclusive** and **digital**.

"The pandemic has robbed young people of many opportunities - to meet and make new friends, to experience and explore new cultures. While we cannot give them that time back, we are proposing today to designate 2022 the European Year of Youth. From climate to social to digital, young people are at the heart of our policymaking and political priorities"

said European Commission President, Ursula von der Leyen.

With the European Year of Youth, the Commission intends to honour and support the generation that has sacrificed the most during the pandemic; to encourage all young people, especially those with fewer opportunities, from disadvantaged backgrounds, from rural or remote areas, or belonging to vulnerable groups, to become active citizens and actors of positive change; to promote opportunities provided by EU policies for young people to support their personal, social and professional development.

### Erasmus+ Enriching lives, opening minds



**Erasmus+** is the EU's programme to support education, training, youth and sport in Europe. It has an estimated budget of €26.2 billion. The 2021-2027 programme places a strong focus on social inclusion, the green and digital transitions, and promoting young people's participation in democratic life.

Erasmus+ offers mobility and cooperation opportunities in:

- higher education
- vocational education and training
- school education (including early childhood education and care)
- adult education
- youth
- sport

#### Who can participate in the Erasmus+ Programme?

Individuals constitute the main target population of the Programme. However, the Programme reaches these individuals mainly through organisations, institutions, bodies or groups that organise such activities. As a general rule, participants in Erasmus+ projects must be established in an EU Member State or third country associated to the Programme.
