About €3.8 billion total EU assistance for Jordan since 2011



Over 195,500 children and youth from Jordan and Syria had access to education and higher education since 2015



Over 208,000 Jordanians and refugees from Syria benefitted from health services since 2015



Over 223,000 Jordanians and refugees from Syria benefitted from livelihood support since 2015



Over 408,000 Jordanians and refugees from Syria benefitted from protection and social cohesion related services since 2015



€1.4 billion in BILATERAL ASSISTANCE to support:

- Regional stability and security, and border management
- Socio-economic development, growth and job creation
- Democratic governance, rule of law and human rights
- Jordan cope with and recover from the impact of COVID-19



€404.5 million in HUMANITARIAN ASSISTANCE

The EU responds to the most urgent needs of Syrians in Jordan with:

- Assistance to cover basic humanitarian needs
- Education
- Access to healthcare, water and sanitation
- Protection activities including legal assistance to facilitate civil and status regularisation

“Seeing our homes destroyed in Syria, we had to leave the country to survive. I moved to Jordan, where I am trying to be an active member of the society. With the support from the EU-funded Cash for Work project, I started providing for my family without relying on anyone else. I would like my children to commit to studying. I would like them to be happy and not have to go through what we have.”

Lina is providing for her family alone since the loss of her husband in 2012. She is a former house collector in the Oxfam’s recycling project in Al Khaldeyah, Mafraq, and a community volunteer.
