Almost €3 billion total EU assistance for Lebanon since 2011



Over 633,000 children and youth from Lebanon and Syria had access to education since 2015



Over 5.7 million Lebanese and refugees from Syria receiving primary health care consultations and essential medicines since 2015



Over 482,000 Lebanese and refugees from Syria benefitted from livelihood support since 2015



Over 945,000 Lebanese and refugees from Syria benefitted from protection and social cohesion related services since 2015

The EU facilitates access to crucial basic services for both Lebanese and refugees from Syria by:

- Promoting economic resilience and stability, job creation and social cohesion
- Supporting Lebanon in delivering access to social protection, primary & higher education, health and water & sanitation services
- Increasing food security



€860 million in HUMANITARIAN ASSISTANCE

The EU responds to the most urgent needs of Syrians and Lebanese in Lebanon with:

- Assistance to cover basic humanitarian needs
- Access to healthcare, shelter, water and sanitation services
- Legal assistance, counselling and case management for refugees from Syria facing legal concerns or having suffered violence and harassment
- Access to education targeting vulnerable out-of-school children
