What is Erasmus+?

- The EU's programme to support education, training, youth and sport
- Funding for programmes, projects and scholarships
- Fosters EU-EU and EU-international cooperation
- Erasmus+ 2021-2027:
 - builds on previous programme 2014-2020
 - more international activities

- Short-term studies in Europe that will count to your degree back home
- Staff mobility opportunities

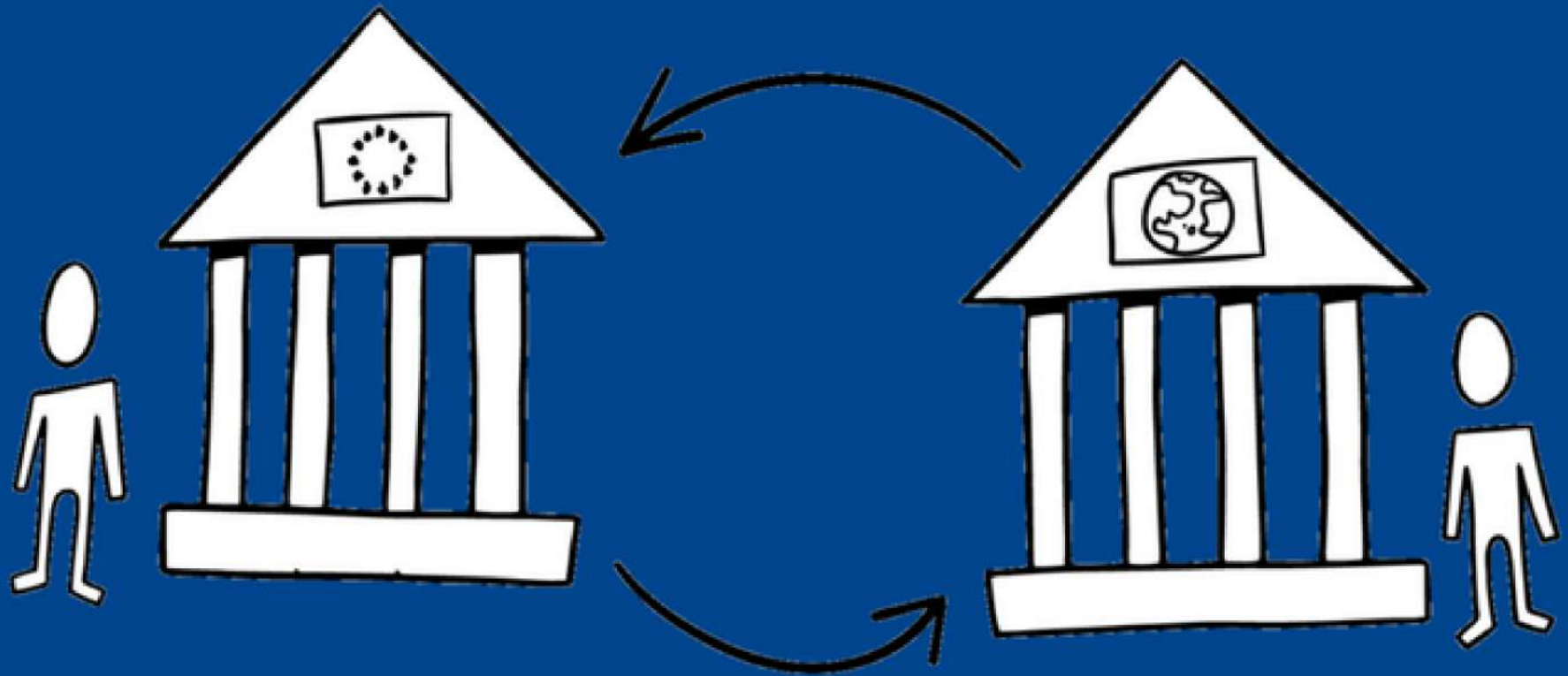
Erasmus Mundus Joint Masters + scholarships

- A full degree programme at Master level, with study at two or more universities

The benefits

- A unique learning experience in Europe
- Receive double/multiple/joint degree, or recognition of your study abroad
- In-depth knowledge of Europe and its higher education
- Improved linguistic skills, intercultural experience
- Better employability
- Academic exchange of knowledge, ideas, contacts

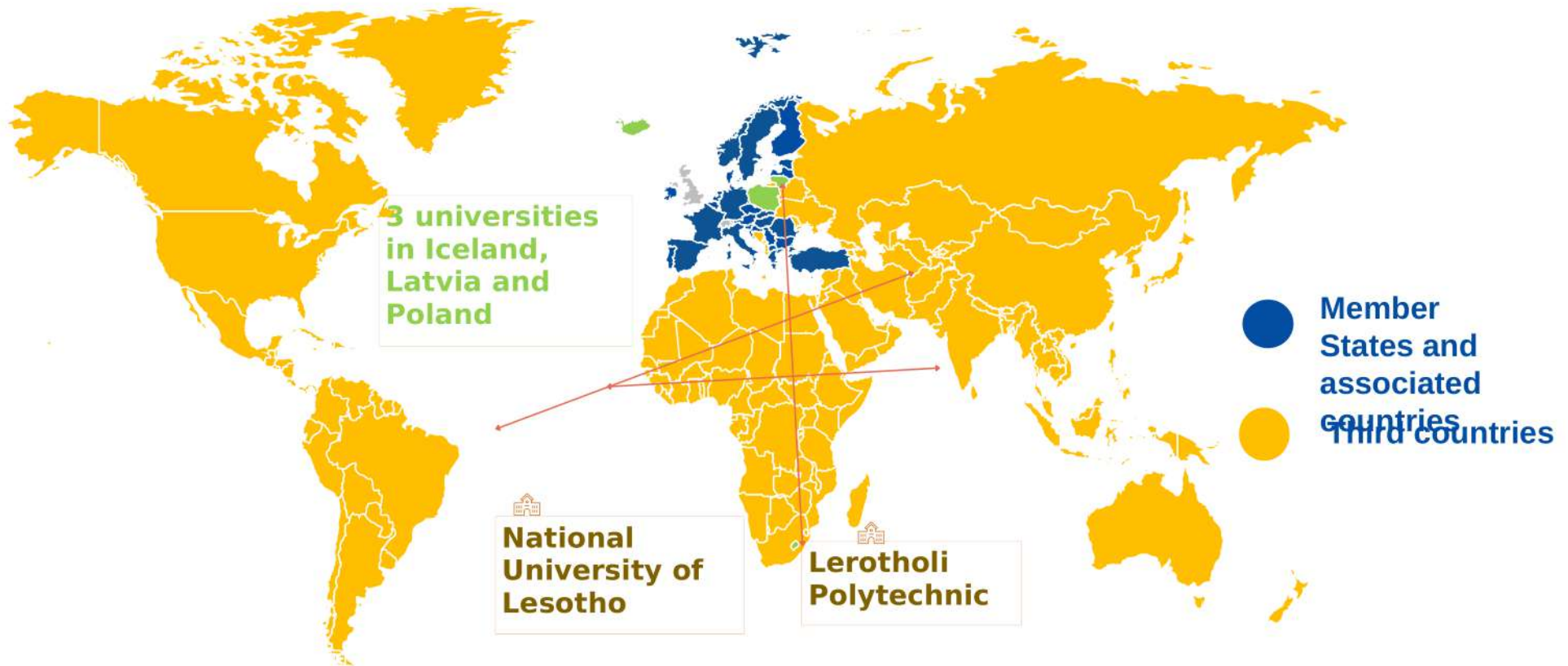
International credit mobility



Credit mobility in brief

- Short-term studies in Europe that will count to your degree back home
- Mobility for Bachelor, Master and Doctoral students – and for staff
- Grants for trainees
- Study periods and traineeships of 2 – 12 months
- Blended mobility (physical mobility of 5 – 30 days + virtual component)
- Grant for travel and subsistence

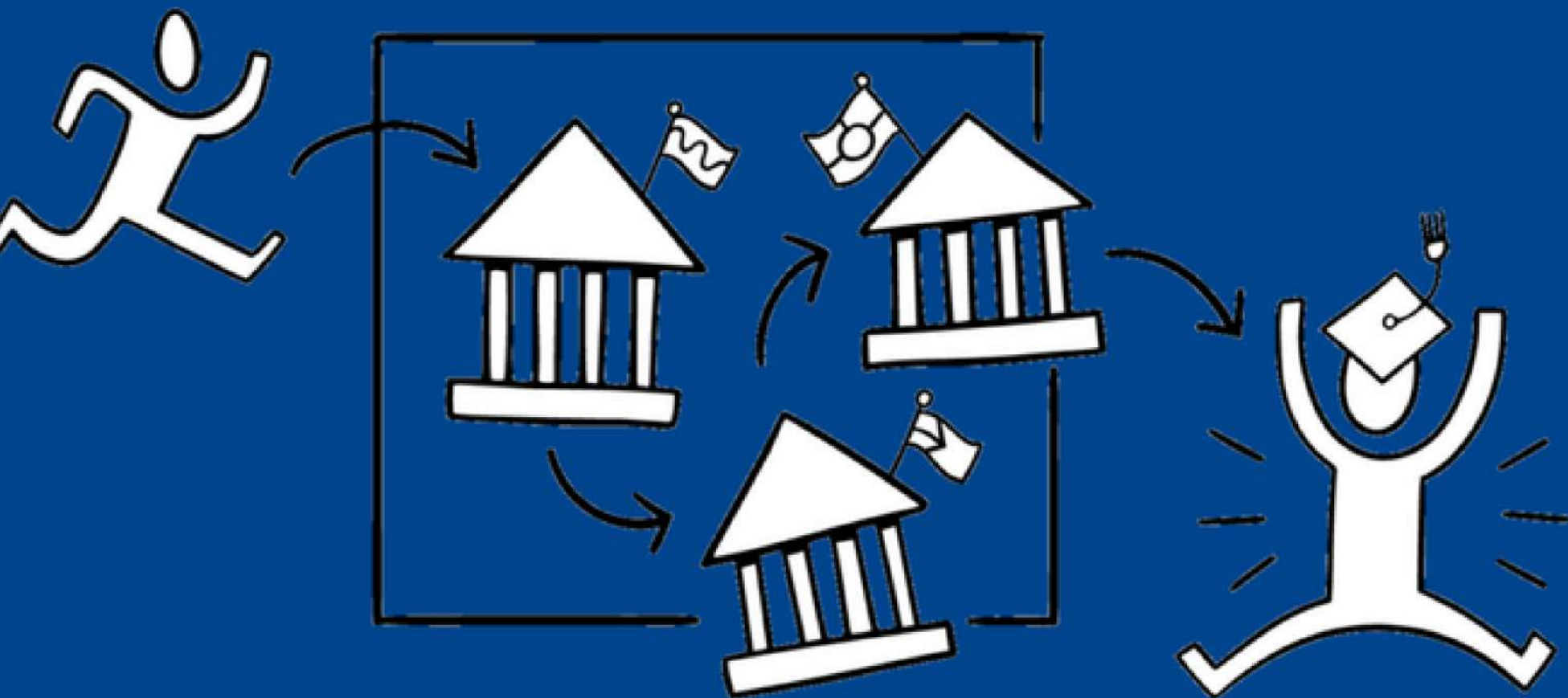
Credit mobility: how to apply

- Contact your own university's international relations office to see:
- which agreements it has
- which study programmes are open for mobility

You can only take part if your university has an Erasmus+ agreement with a university in Europe.

Erasmus Mundus Joint Masters

- A full degree programme at Master level
- Study at two or more universities
- Full scholarships (participation fees, travel, living costs) for the best-ranked applicants from all over the world.
- Over 200 programmes to choose from in 2024

How to apply for a scholarship

Each EM Masters programme selects its students

- Check the catalogue of masters courses
- Apply directly to the course – consult the catalogue
- Application period: late 2023-early 2024 for programmes starting in September 2024

Anyone can apply: in final year of bachelors or later.

No age limits – you can apply even if you have been working.

Languages?

Vast majority of Master courses are taught in English, but...

- Whatever the language of instruction, it is important to have the right level of linguistic ability, and...
- You'll also have the chance to enroll in tailor-made language courses. These add to your skills and improve your employability

Successful?

Prepare your visa requests/other administrative procedures

Ensure you have all the necessary documents ready well in advance (originals, certified copies)

Check your rights and obligations in the student agreement

Ask advice and support from fellow students who have already benefited from an EM scholarship (see EMA website)

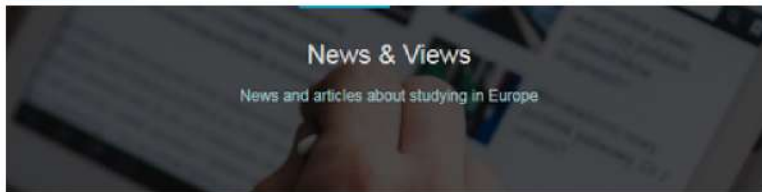
